Just ask Mr McDowell 	 Daily reading. Your child will have an appropriate level reading book that will provide them with suitable challenge whilst also building confidence as a reader. We encourage reading to be done daily, before bed is always a good opportunity to build reading into the daily routine. When listening to your child read, let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation, focus on punctuation and how expression should change. You could also try and share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day. You could take it in turns reading or read sections together. Reading to, and with, your child is also powerful and should not be underestimated.
