

## Homework Information & Expectations

Year 5/6



- Homework is stuck into books and sent home on Fridays.
- Homework is due in on Wednesday mornings. We go over homework in lessons on Wednesday, so it is important children bring their homework to school with them.
- Each week children will get 3 pieces of homework (usually English, Reading and Maths). They should spend 40 minutes on each piece of English and Maths work. In addition children should spend 20 minutes, three times a week, on reading and filling in their reading record card.
- If children are unsure of what to do when at home, they should speak to their class teacher on Monday.
- Children who complete their homework will receive stamps towards their learning to learn badges. There is a possibility of up to 5 stamps for completing homework (1 for English task, 1 for Maths task, 1 for Reading and up to 2 more for quality or extra work) which will be recorded in their books.
- If homework is not done to the appropriate standard or is incomplete, children will attend a lunchtime homework catch up session to do the missed work.
- If children are not well, homework can be given in when they return to school, however there may not be time to mark work before books are sent home again.
- Teachers are not able to provide homework when unauthorised holidays are taken. Homework returned after unauthorised holidays will be treated as late.
- Homework is not sent home during school holidays. The exception to this is for Year 6 children during the Easter holidays before their KS2 tests.
- Homework tasks may refer to reading, writing or maths targets; these are stuck into books so they can be referred to.



We are looking forward to children building on the good homework habits started last year. Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns about homework.
