New First Aid Procedure for September 2025

From September, we will be using a new online recording system for first aid that will be used across the whole trust; this will help us to track patterns much more robustly. The main change for parents will be that there will no longer be paper forms sent home to explain if a child has had first aid. However, children will wear a wristband with the details (time of incident, nature of incident and first aid given) so that parents and carers are aware.

Red – for any head or face bumps

Blue for all other injuries.

We will still also still call home if your child has had a head bump or we have any concerns about an injury or bump that a child has had. We will remind parents and carers again about the changes in September as well so please don't worry!

This will be a new process for us, so we thank you in advance for your patience as we navigate the new system.



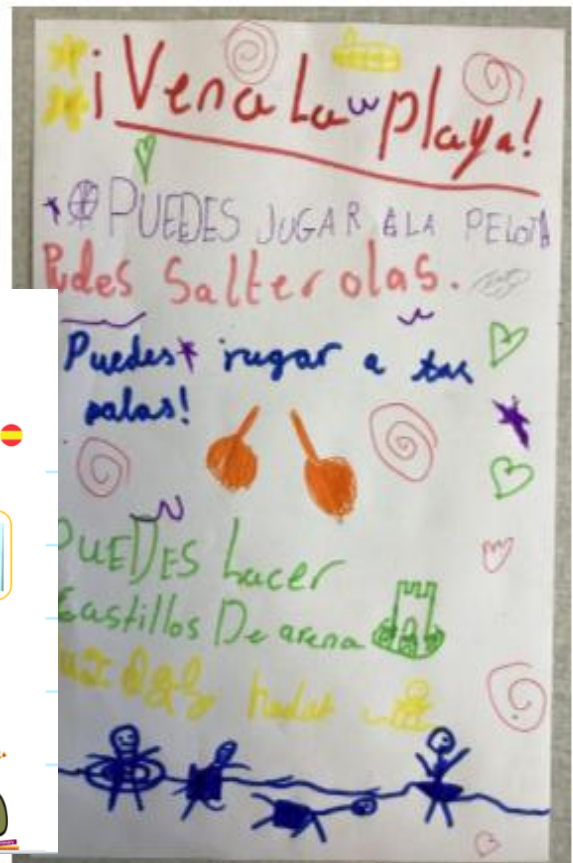

School Development Priorities updates

We feel it is important to share our school development priorities with our school community, and as the year draws to an end, we wanted to celebrate some of the great things that have been achieved to make our school even better! Of course, this does not capture all of the wonderful things we do each day, but each year we choose some core areas that we look to improve. We look forward to sharing next year's with you soon!

- ✓ We have worked hard to develop our teaching and learning in **Maths** across the school – we have worked closely with the BBO Maths hub to implement the latest research and advice. A recent trust review commented on the impact of these actions – thank you to Mr McDowell for leading on this.
- ✓ We have further developed our **curriculum enrichment** with new clubs, visits, sports competitions and also our new playground games development – this has been led by Mrs Russell and is a hugely important part of our vision to nurture talent and develop the whole child
- ✓ Miss Higgins has completed her **Forest School** training and we have completed the extensive paperwork as well to get started! We have purchased lots of new resources as well – this has started already and we will begin with Early Years next year (with a view to extend more widely next year)
- ✓ Developing our **Early Years outside areas** have been a key project – Miss Amber and Team have worked really hard and have lots of plans to keep making it even better! We now have a wonderful outside stage and a growing area – we can't wait to see what vegetables they have grown
- ✓ **Attendance** has been a real focus – thank you for your support! Our attendance has increased to 93% - we still have work to do but we are pleased to see the impact of our work to support all of our families. As always do reach out if you need support!

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about NINTENDO SWITCH 2

Nintendo launched its Switch 2 games console in early June 2025 – its first new console in eight years. While it builds on the original's success by remaining compatible with certain existing games, it also adds powerful hardware and new features like GameChat and a USB-C camera. As more children look to upgrade, it's important to understand how this new console might affect their play and safety.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

EASIER TO ACCESS MATURE CONTENT

Despite Nintendo's reputation for family-friendly titles, mature games like *Cyberpunk 2077* and *Hitman* have been released onto the platform. With the Switch 2's improved performance, developers will be able to port even more mature-rated games. These may appeal to children due to their popularity, but they contain content that is highly unsuitable for young audiences.

IN-APP & GAME STORE PURCHASES

The Nintendo eShop enables purchases with just a few taps. If payment details are saved and PIN protection is disabled, children may unknowingly make costly purchases – including game add-ons, cosmetic items or entire new releases – without parental approval.

UNRESTRICTED ONLINE PLAY IN SOME GAMES

While GameChat is one feature, Switch 2 also connects to the broader Nintendo Switch Online service. Many free-to-play titles like *Fortnite* or *Splatoon 3* allow voice or text chat with strangers unless chat settings are adjusted, meaning children could encounter inappropriate language or unwanted contact.

GAMECHAT & REAL-TIME VOICE COMMUNICATION

GameChat enables live chatting with up to 12 people, even across different games, with optional video and screen-sharing. Though children under 16 are restricted to chatting only with approved friends, the sheer interactivity could raise privacy concerns or create pressure to remain online longer.

CAMERA COMPATIBILITY & PRIVACY CONCERNS

The optional USB-C camera supports video calling and facial overlays in games; however, this also raises the risk of cyberbullying or the unwanted sharing of personal images. The camera can be disabled, removed or covered, and parental controls are essential to manage how and when it is used.

POWERFUL PULL OF FAMILIAR CHARACTERS

Nintendo's mascot, Mario – along with Pikachu, Donkey Kong and others – remains hugely appealing to younger audiences, especially after the success of the recent film, *The Super Mario Bros. Movie* (2023). These beloved icons are central to Nintendo's branding and often feature in merchandising, adverts and in-game promotions, creating strong emotional attachments in children and a sense of urgency to keep up with their peers.

Advice for Parents & Educators

CHECK RATINGS & USE PARENTAL CONTROLS

Every Switch and Switch 2 game comes with a PEGI age rating. Before buying one, ensure the content matches your child's age. Use the Nintendo Parental Controls app to monitor gameplay, set screen-time limits and manage friend requests.

REVIEW FRIEND LISTS AND CHAT PERMISSIONS

Child profiles are restricted to chatting with approved friends only, but it's good practice to regularly check their friend list and communication settings. Use the Parental Controls app to switch off voice or video chat if necessary.

REMOVE OR RESTRICT PAYMENT METHODS

Avoid accidental spending by unlinking credit cards from the device. Instead, consider adding funds via prepaid eShop cards or requiring a PIN for purchases. Some banking apps can also be set to approve transactions manually.

ENCOURAGE OPEN CONVERSATIONS

Teach children how to block, report and capture any behaviour or content that makes them uncomfortable. The console's built-in tools allow them to create screenshots and video clips, which can aid in reporting any issues. Keeping an open dialogue helps children feel supported and safe.

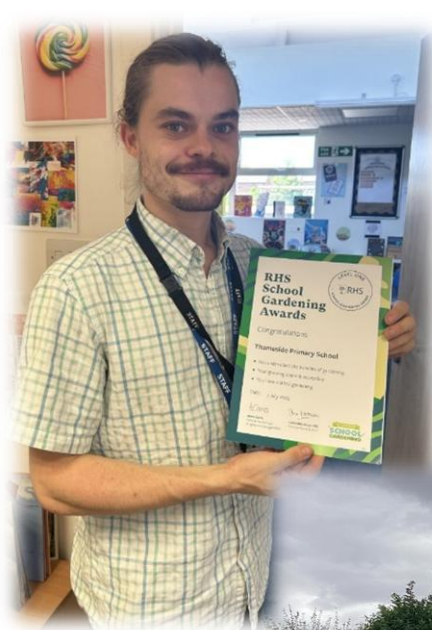

Nursery

We have had a fantastic summer term in Nursery. The weather has been beautiful, and we have been making the most of it. We have had a few days with the paddling pools. We did lots of splashing and having fun. This term our topic has been transport and journeys. We started with the story, 'we are going on a bear hunt' where we made bear caves and went on our own sensory bear hunt in the garden. We also looked at lots of different types of transport when we read another lovely book, 'The journey home from grandpa's'. Our traditional tale this term was 'Little Red Riding Hood'. The children really enjoyed making wolf soup and artwork using anything red.

In Maths we have been looking at patterns and shapes. The children are now have an excellent knowledge of shape names and how many sides they have. In Phonics, we have been fine tuning our rhyming, alliteration and oral blending.

The Early years sports day was a high light with much excitement. The children had been practicing for weeks and were very good at all the stations on offer. We also enjoyed fantastic support from the parents.

Reception

Reception have had a fantastic term. We have had some great forest school sessions where we have been exploring the outside, painting and even making our own hot chocolate and roasting marshmallows on the fire!



This term we have been learning all about oceans, sea animals and the water cycle. We have been exploring the different animals that live in the sea and how we can protect them from the rubbish in the water.

We had lots of fun creating our own mini beach in the garden using the paddling pools and sand pit!



Year 1

Year 1 have had an amazing term! They have all written their own stories which they got to share with Mrs Youngman and Reception who enjoyed listening to them. They have also all written a pet fact file about how to look after a pet. Once they had finished these they even had a couple of special visitors - 2 tiny kittens called Mischief and Mayhem who came in to show the children just how much looking after they need!

In Maths Year 1 have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, as well as counting in 1s to much bigger numbers! They have also started learning how to tell the time and all about fractions such as halves and quarters.

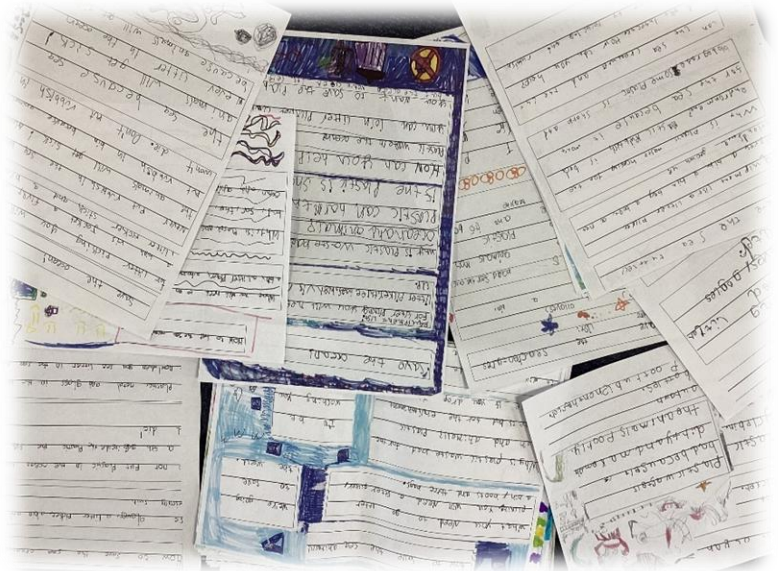
Year 1 have enjoyed making their own moving picture books this term, using the familiar story of Jack and the Beanstalk. Jack can now 'climb' the beanstalk and 'hide' in the oven using the sliders that the children have made. It has also been a term with lots of lovely special events and assemblies. Sports day was definitely a favourite!

Year 2

We have been incredibly busy finishing up some of our units ready for the summer holidays. This term in English, we created posters explaining how we can reduce plastic waste in the ocean. The children revisited the use of apostrophes, commas in a list, imperative verbs, and compound and complex sentences. The posters were simply brilliant—packed full of the taught writing techniques and some lovely illustrations to match. Hopefully, you'll be able to see some of them around the school on your next visit.

In Science this term, we have been learning all about conservation and how we can do our bit to help our native wildlife. We learnt all about local pollinators and how we can introduce more flowers in and around our school and homes to

encourage bees, butterflies, and moths. We also went on a minibeast hunt and discovered all the different creatures that call our school home.



Year 3

It has been a busy term in Year 3. Firstly, we have loved improving our football skills. We developed our attack and defence so much that our final tournament games were a real spectacle to watch! From super goalkeeping to sensational shooting, the whole class have made great progress.

In History, we have been learning all about Roman Britain. We can now explain why the Romans wanted to invade here and why Hadrian's wall was built. We also enjoyed learning about Boudicca and how she stood up to the Roman army. Our writing has been linked to this theme too as we created our own narrative inspired by the book "Escape from Pompeii".



Our Science lessons have been all about plants and we are looking forward to seeing the results of our radish growing experiment which is looking at the impact of fertiliser on the size of the radishes we have grown.

We must also mention the fabulous Spanish lessons, which have seen the children improving their speaking, listening and writing about food they might eat on a picnic alongside using polite requests. Their confidence and engagement in these sessions amazes me!

Year 4

Year 4 have been busy bees this Summer Term! They have particularly enjoyed violin this year and demonstrated all their new musical skills in the end of year violin recital. Year 4 have shown excellent teamwork and leadership in the end of unit rounders tournament, which they played with Year 2. Year 4 make all

Once you have created your account, you will receive an email with the next steps on downloading the app.

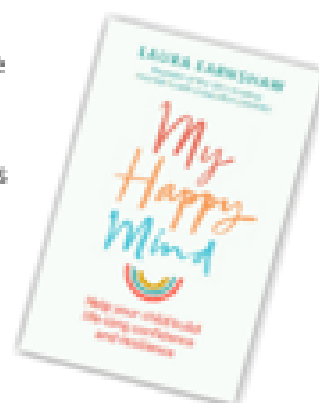
